Rosh Hashanah - Hebrew for Christians

Rosh Hashanah is also known as Yom Teruah, the "Feast of Shouting" (or "trumpets"), though the name was changed to Rosh Hashanah during Talmudic times Tradition stated that the universe was created by the LORD on Rosh Hashanah (or on Elul 25, so that Rosh Hashanah marks the sixth day of creation, when the LORD created Adam and Eve)

BIBLICAL PRINCIPLES OF ROSH HASHANAH

WORD, 1 Cor 14:8, a voice which calls the nation to prepare for the coming Feast of Atonement (great sifting, baptism of fire, cleansing), which is followed by the Feast of Tabernacles (the full adoption and redemption of the body) Rosh Hashanah is the beginning of a ten day period which ends on Yom Kippur (The Feast Day of Atonement)
